The body armor is embroidered with “Tempered by Fire.” Professor Jeng Hoang-ell of the Department of Architecture, a former president of the Kendo Club, indicated that the three words embodied the spirit of kendo, for fire symbolizes the painstaking discipline required for kendo training. He wished all the members to be reborn from the fire.

Members of the Kendo Club were very touched by the scene. Club member Tsai Chun-ping, a senior in the Department of Civil Engineering, expressed that he was so proud of their close friendship with the alumni of the Tamkang Kendo Association.
