The Department of Information and Communication held an opening ceremony for a joint-event— ‘Founding meeting of the departmental association for alumni affairs’ and ‘Innovative digital multi-media research room’ at the Communication Building, room 0306 on Nov. 8, the 53rd anniversary day. Alumni of the department were also invited to attend and share their experiences of further studies or career choices with the students.

This department is relatively young, six years old in fact, generating approximately 100 plus graduates two years. All the six faculty members could still recall the name and faces of them. For instance, Professor Shih Chien-chou teased one of this year’ s graduates who he recognized immediately by knocking her head with a folder complaining that the student did not come to greet him first.
