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MORE THAN 150 JUNIORS LEAVE FOR STUDY ABROAD PROGRAM

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"I am smiling while dreaming when thinking of going to participate in TKU's junior abroad program but I am crying when thinking of leaving Taiwan," so said Lin Yi-ying, a junior from the German Department.

Lin made these remarks when she was taking part in the flag-handing ceremony of the junior abroad program for the 2002-2003 academic year. President Chang Horng-jinh presided over the ceremony held on Taipei Campus on Aug. 17. In addition to 156 juniors who are leaving soon for the student exchange program, a lot of well- wishers, including Georgii Zynoview, Deputy Representative of Moscow-Taipei Economic and Cultural Coordination Commission, Representative Office in Taipei and parents of program' s participants witnessed the ceremony.
